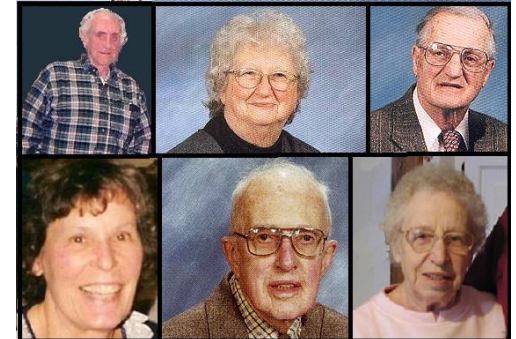

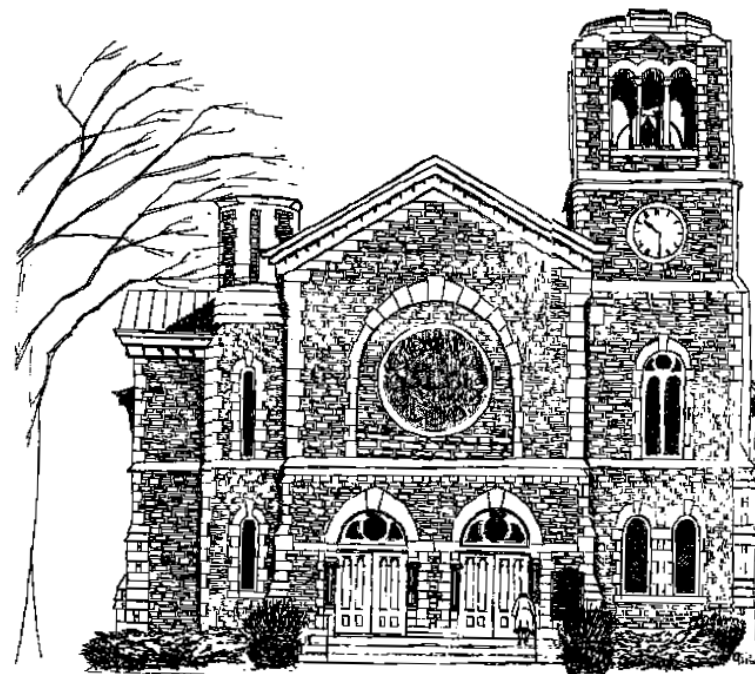

NAME TAGS: If yours is missing or your name is wrong, please let an usher know, and we will supply you with a temporary tag until a replacement is made. If you're visiting, an usher will be glad to make you a name tag.

A **REST ROOM** (wheelchair accessible) is located off the narthex to your left as you enter the church. More restrooms may be found downstairs in the hall that parallels Williams St.

THE NURSERY is located off the narthex to your right as you enter the church. A diaper-changing table is there for your convenience.

THE COUNTRY PANTRY NEEDS: The Pantry food bank is requesting donations of crackers, granola or cereal bars, canned spaghetti or ravioli, canned fruit, and shampoo. We also hope to add some small toys for the children. These include playing cards, jump ropes, bubbles, crayons, activity books, and sidewalk chalk. Please leave items in the basket in the narthex.

HOPE HOUSE is currently undergoing a severe cash flow problem compounded by a delay in government funding. Please consider Hope House in this season of giving thanks!

HOPE HOUSE WISH LIST: Empty coffee cans with plastic lids for grease, brown bags for their Brown Bag Lunch Program, individual serve fruits or snacks, lasagna noodles, parsley, Italian seasoning, garlic powder, sugar substitute in bulk for baking, a Pyrex glass measuring cup for 8 cups and for 4 cups, a good baster to remove grease, sea salt, taco seasoning, beef and chicken broth. They especially need toiletries such as soap, deodorant, shampoo and conditioner, feminine hygiene products, toothbrushes and paste, etc. Since people are not traveling as much, Hope House is not receiving as many toiletries.



Over 40 Scouts, Cubs, and Adult Leaders and Parents from Packs 9 & 44 and Troops 9 & 44 and Venture Crew 9 will be **SCOUTING FOR FOOD** on **Saturday, November 13th**. They hope to obtain over 3000 bags of food (canned or boxed, no glass) from Clinton and Clarks Mills (Kirkland) area residents who receive notice of this pickup when door hangers with donation information are distributed **Saturday, November 6th**. All the

food collected goes to the Country Pantry Food Bank in the basement of the Church of Annunciation in Clark Mills. This food bank provides food for over 80 families in the Kirkland area. **Bags of food should be put out before 9:00 AM on Saturday, November 13th**. They should be hung on door knobs or placed on door steps or street side entrances **in clear sight from the street**.
